



## **Lieutenant Colonel Jason R. Wing Commander, Warrior Transition Battalion**

Lieutenant Colonel Jason R. Wing assumed command of the Warrior Transition Battalion at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Wash. on May 25, 2011. As the WTB commander, he oversees the successful healing and transitions of hundreds of Warriors in Transition as they return back to their regular duty in the Army or become successful civilian Veterans.

LTC Wing earned his commission in 1993 through the Reserve Officers' Training Corps and was designated a Distinguished Military Graduate.

LTC Wing began his Army career as a medical platoon leader with 2nd Battalion, 15th Infantry in Schweinfurt, Germany where he deployed as a U.N. peacekeeper to the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. In addition to his distinguished Army career, LTC Wing has held numerous civilian occupations to include chief of operations, Cocoa Pete's Chocolate Adventures, and chief operations officer, Pinnacle Business Finance. He currently serves on the school board commission at St. Patrick's Catholic School in Tacoma, Wash.

LTC Wing holds a Masters Degree in Business Administration from Pacific Lutheran University and a Bachelor of Business degree from Gonzaga University in Spokane, Wash. He was recently recognized as one of 50 outstanding alumni at PLU's School of Business 50th Anniversary celebration.
